By the end of its first year of implementation, the Sociopreneur initiative will foster the creation of at least two startups with innovative solutions for child rights problems, potentially impacting 9,200 children in Tola.

Sociopreneurs are generous, visionary and innovative local leaders who have chosen to invest with both their hearts and minds to create value for children. Mukul and UNICEF have joined forces in a unique alliance, creating a new model of responsible tourism for children, where sociopreneurs lead.

innovative development

The new model of Responsible Tourism for Children is not a traditional top-down model of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR), where the company dictates where the social investment will go. Neither is it traditional development work based on donation and implementation of projects and service delivery.

The model is based on collaboration between a wide range of actors, local and international, public and private, co-creating innovative solutions for social problems related to children while recognizing business opportunities.

how it works

1. Identify problems related to child rights

UNICEF will make an in-depth analysis of the situation of children in Tola and identify problems in critical areas of child development such as health, education, protection and water & sanitation.

2. Map opportunities in the value chain of the tourism sector The analysis is also expected to unveil opportunities in the intersection between child rights and tourism that can spark innovative solutions using social business.

3. Identify local 'Sociopreneurs'

Local actors will be selected based on their potential for social entrepreneurship, commitment, and vision. These will be called 'Sociopreneurs'. UNICEF will provide capacity support to these selected individuals as well as to the local government in Tola.

4. Mobilize international actors for collaborative solutions At global level, UNICEF Nicaragua will mobilize a wide range of individuals from diverse backgrounds to guide, mentor and collaborate with the local sociopreneurs on creating social businesses that will contribute to solving problems related to children.

tola is a municipality located in the department of Rivas on the Pacific coast of Nicaragua.

Tourism is considered a strategic opportunity for development in the area, which faces high disparities limiting the wellbeing and development of children.
